

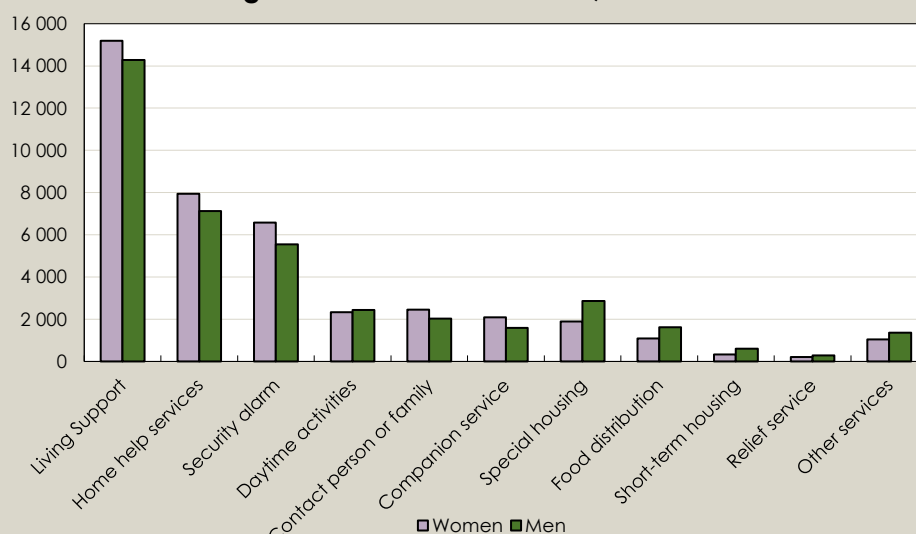
Statistics on Care and Services for Persons with Impairments 2021

Living support, Home help services and Security alarms are the most common services under the Social Services Act to persons, 0 to 64 years old, with impairments. In total just under 60 000 persons with impairment received services on 31 October 2020.

Living support the most common service

October 31, 2021 there were 59,627 recipients of service due to physical or mental impairment under the Social Services Act. The most common service received was *Living support*, a service in the form of support in daily life in the individuals own home. The second and third most common services were Home help services in ordinary housing and Security alarms (see Figure 1).

Even gender distribution

The gender distribution among those receiving at least one service October 31 2021, was even; 51 percent were women and 49 percent were men. The gender difference was small also for specific services. The service with the highest share of male recipients was Short-term housing (64 percent men). The service with the highest share of female recipients was Companion service (57 percent women).

Home help most common amongst 55+

For all age groups between 0- and 54-years Living support was the most commonly received service. For the oldest age group, 55–64 years, Home help services were the most common. Table 1 shows the most common services by age group.

Persons with impairments may receive services from the municipality both according to the Social Services Act (SoL) which covers the services included in this report, but also from the Act concerning Support and Service for Persons with Certain Functional Impairments, LSS. Services under LSS are presented in another report. Some people have services provided from both Acts and appear in both reports. This report presents statistics for persons younger than 65 years who receive SoL-services.
